FACTS	What does Fort Washington do with your personal information?
WHY?	As a registered adviser, Fort Washington must comply with SEC Regulation S-P, which requires registered advisers to adopt policies and procedures to protect the nonpublic personal information of natural person consumers and customers and to disclose to such persons, policies and procedures for protecting that information.
WHAT?	<p>The types of nonpublic personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Information we receive from you through applications or other forms, correspondence, or conversations, including, but not limited to, your name, address, phone number, Social Security number, assets, income and date of birth• Information about your transactions with us, our affiliates*, or others, including, but not limited to, your account number and balance, payment history, parties to transactions, cost basis information, and other financial information.
HOW?	<p>To fulfill our privacy commitment we have instituted firm-wide practices to safeguard your personal information.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• We maintain physical, electronic, and procedural safeguards to protect your nonpublic personal information, to ensure that we are complying with our own policy, industry practices, and federal regulations.• We restrict access to nonpublic personal information about you to authorized employees who need the information to administer your business.• We do not disclose nonpublic personal information about our current or former clients to nonaffiliated third parties, except in the following circumstances:<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ As necessary to provide the service that the client has requested or authorized, or to maintain and service the client's account.○ As required by regulatory authorities or law enforcement officials.○ To the extent reasonably necessary to prevent fraud and unauthorized transactions.○ Upon consent from the client.• We do not participate in third party services that may collect personally identifiable information about your online activities over time or across different websites when using our website.• We do not respond to browsers "do not track" signals or other mechanisms regarding the collection of personally identifiable information about your online activities over time or across different websites when using our website.• Should your relationship end with Fort Washington, your nonpublic personal information will remain protected in accordance with our privacy practices outlined in this policy. <p>Annually, we provide a copy of our Privacy Policy Disclosure to clients.</p>

Website Use of Cookies

Through cookies, we capture your IP address (the number assigned to your computer when you use the Internet), your domain name, browser and platform types, time you accessed our website, and your activity while on our website. We do not use Web Beacons to monitor your activity on our website.

Like most websites, we use "cookies" to record information while you are on our website. A "cookie" is a small text file that is stored on your hard drive whenever you visit our website. Cookies help us personalize your session, making your movements through our website faster and easier. Our web server sends cookies securely to protect your privacy and security from being compromised when you accept a cookie from our website. Cookies cannot get data from your hard drive, read your e-mail, or access other sensitive information. We never use cookies to collect information for distribution to third parties. Third parties, including our service providers, may collect information about your online activities over time and across different websites, including when you visit our website. These companies may place anonymous cookies on your computer. These third party cookies help us provide relevant marketing to you when you visit, or based on your activity, on our website or third party websites. These cookies do not contain personally identifiable information.

You can set your browser to accept all cookies, block all cookies, or send a message when a cookie is being sent. **Please be aware that if you reject or disable cookies on your web browser, parts of our website may not be available to you.**


To set cookie preferences when using Internet Explorer:

- On the Menu bar, select Tools-Internet Options.
- Select the Privacy tab.
- Drag the slider to the security level you want. The text will indicate what types of cookies you have blocked.

To set cookie preferences when using Firefox:

- Select Tools-Options-Privacy.
- Select "Cookies".
- Use the check boxes and drop-down menus to set your general preferences.
- Click the "Exceptions" button to block or permit cookies from selected sites.
- Click "OK".

To set cookie preferences when using Google Chrome:

- Click the Chrome menu  on the browser toolbar.
- Select **Settings**.
- Click **Show advanced settings**.
- In the "Privacy" section, click the **Content settings** button.
- In the "Cookies" section, you can change the following cookies settings:
 - Delete cookies.
 - Block cookies by default.
 - Allow cookies by default.
 - Keep cookies and site data by default until you quit your browser.
 - Make exceptions for cookies from specific websites or domains.
